

## What's a BANSHEE?

## Project BANSHEE- Overview

- 1. Seven (7) different investigations
- 2. Victims included:
  - a. Three (3) persons [age 60-89 (All have passed)]
  - b. Charity- Story Book Primate Farm
  - c. Two financial institutions
- 3. Six (6) accused
- 4. 77 charges

## Project BANSHEE - Outcomes

- 1. Case split into two trials
- 2. Conviction of two accused prior to trial
- 3. Convictions of three (3) accused after seven week jury trial:
  - a. Sentence AC 90 days
  - b. Reverend STEWART 15 months
  - c. BUDIMIOROVIC Part I- six years/ Part II- six months

## Project BANSHEE - Outcomes

- 4. Sentencing with "fine-in-lieu" orders (two persons)
- 5. Seizure of a house
- 6. Coverage through mortgage insurer
- 7. Court ordered "staying of charges" Part II

## The impact upon Ethel



## Economic impact specific to ETHEL

- Loss of entire savings \$ 62,000.00(+)
- Credit card debit \$ 45,000.00(+)
- Mortgage against her home \$ 150,000.00

## The true impact upon ETHEL

- The potential loss of the home she had lived in for 35(+) years
- The realization her "friends" were not her friends
- Loneliness
- Rapid cognitive decline.

## Lesson Learned:

- The true impact of victimization upon seniors
- The impact upon caregivers
- The importance of certain steps police must take
- The challenges of holding perpetrators of abuse accountable civil and criminal process.



## Reporting







Long-Term Care Homes Act s.24(1)

Any person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that abuse has occurred, or may occur, shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it was based to the Director under the LTCHA.





Here is a list of the top 10 scams and frauds currently being used to prey on vulnerable seniors during the COVID19 crisis\*

- A version of the CRA scam where fraudsters threaten that
- A phone call from someone posing as a representative from the provincial or municipal health authority saying that you have been found to have COVID or you have been found to have been exposed to COVID and to give them your credit card to pay for testing or results.
- Canada Post / UPS delivery frauds a telephone call canab Post OPS delivery males a temperare assigning that you have an (often international) package whithas been attempted to be delivered, but you need to call them to pay duty or shipping first.

- banking information so that they can set up a direct deposit for government funds due to COVID.


#### Family, Friends & Community Focused

- Deceptive websites asking you to help purchase Personal Protective Equipment for front line health care providers
- Community helping scams where callers say that they are
- reaching out to vulnerable seniors during the COVID19 crisis. To ensure that you are speaking with a reputable organization, ask them for their phone number and then call them back before providing any personal information And NEVER give out financial information.




