



MINISTRY MANDATED REPORTING HOW DO I REPORT ARLISE?



Retirement Homes Acts.67

Long-Term Care Homes Act s.24(1)

Any person who has reasonable grounds to suspect that abuse has occurred, or may occur, shall immediately report the suspicion and the information upon which it was based to the Director under the LTCHA.

Long-Term Care ACTION Line 1-866-434-0144 Anyone who sees or suspects a situation that harms or puts a resident at risk of harm must report it to the RHRA.



COVID19 Specific Frauds and Scams Here is a list of the top 10 scams and frauds currently being used to prey on vulnerable seniors during the COVID19 crisis* Government Focused Family, Friends & Community Focused For More Information Emails, phone calls and test messages encouraging seriors to apply for COVID related government benefits by clicking on a link.
