# What is World Elder Abuse Awareness Day?

**Rights Don't Get Old** 



June 15, 2023

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD) was launched June 15, 2006 by the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse and recognised as a United Nations Day by the General Assembly in its resolution A/RES/66/127 adopted in 2011. The resolution invites all Member States, organizations of the United Nations system and other international and regional organizations, as well as civil society, including non-governmental organizations and individuals to observe this day in an appropriate manner.

WEAAD also supports the United Nations International Plan of Action that acknowledges the significance of elder abuse as a public health and human rights issue.

Since its inception, communities around the world have used this day as an opportunity to raise awareness of elder abuse and neglect of older persons, by sharing information about the facts of elder abuse, the rights of older persons, and resources and services to support seniors' safety and well-being.

Elder Abuse Prevention Ontario will join communities locally, regionally, nationally and across the world to heighten awareness of elder abuse. WEAAD activities are planned to mobilize community action, including educational workshops, senior fairs, and proclamations, all in an effort to create awareness of elder abuse and engage people in discussions on how to promote dignity and respect of older adults.

You can plan a variety of activities, as individuals or as part of an organization. Below are some examples.







# Ideas for Raising Awareness on June 15th

#### **COMMUNITY ACTION**

- Wear purple (scarf, ribbon, dress, tie, suit, flowers, hat..) - the official colour for WEAAD.
- 2. Order or make purple cupcakes, purple drinks, bouquets.
- 3. Organize a community walk or BBQ/dinner.
- 4.Organize a WEAAD neighbourhood party and sell purple cupcakes, donate the proceeds to a local elder abuse prevention organization.
- 5. Order purple cupcakes for the residents of your senior centre.
- 6. Throw a WEAAD event/training session at work with purple cookies for your staff.







#### Selfie:

- Take a selfie and include something purple in the photo (even background!)
- Add the hashtag #WEAAD2023 and a simple message to show your support for seniors this WEAAD.

#### **EDUCATION**

- Learn the facts on elder abuse.
- Organize a presentation focused on recognizing the signs of abuse, prevention tips and local community support services.
- Host a webinar or virtual training online, invite politicians, survivors of elder abuse, or field experts to speak.
- Share posters/flyers on elder abuse in local businesses and organizations
- Promote intergenerational connections

#### **POLITICAL ACTION**

- Ask local leaders Mayor, MP, MPP, to proclaim June 15 as World Elder Abuse Awareness Day.
- Send letters to local politicians to advocate for funding to support Elder Abuse Prevention Networks.
- Invite political leaders to attend your WEAAD events.





#### **MEDIA**

- Post WEAAD Logos and images on your website, social media, blogs, or add them to your email signature block.
- Re-post WEAAD <u>posters</u> on social media and use the hashtags #RightsDoNotGetOld and #WEAAD2023
- Engage the local media to write a story or highlight current community work to address elder abuse.
- Send a press release, or submit an editorial to discuss elder abuse issues and a call for action.
- Develop Public Service Announcements for local TV or radio stations.
- Be a guest speaker on a local radio show to discuss key issues affecting older adults.


