A Plus account provides access to all the tools available on Job Bank. To sign up, provide some personal details securely and answer a few questions about your skills, experience, and education. You will then be able to:

- ▶ Create a professional Canadian resume.
- ▶ Receive email notifications when new jobs that could interest you are posted.
- ▶ Save jobs in your favourites to know when they are filled.
- ▶ Be matched with jobs that you are qualified for.
- ▶ Get invitations from employers who want you to apply for their jobs.
- ▶ Send applications directly to Job Bank to know when employers have seen them.

Moving across the country for work can allow you to:

- ▶ Put your skills to work where they are needed.
- ▶ Find more job opportunities.
- ▶ Find wage differences across the country.

- ▶ **My Service Canada Account (MSCA)** is a secure online portal offered by the Canadian government that allows you to access information related to various government benefits.
- ▶ Create an account to access and manage a wide range of government services and benefits at canada.ca/en/employment-social-development/services/my-account.
- ▶ It takes just a few steps, and the next time you visit all you have to do is sign in.
 - You must be at least 12 years old, and
 - You must access MSCA only as yourself. No one is authorized to use or create an account of your behalf.
- ▶ The **Benefits Finder** is a tool that can help you find federal, provincial and territorial programs, services and benefits that you may be eligible to receive. It can be accessed at canada.ca/en/services/benefits/finder.
- ▶ The Benefits Finder will ask you a few questions and uses your answers to give you a list of benefits for which you may be eligible. The more questions you answer, the more customized and accurate your results will be. It does not collect or track your information.
